

CE Mark credibility for business

- Generally Businesses want to comply
- Modular assessment popular
- Focus must be on safety rather than rigid compliance with a standard
- Established regime, consistency of advice



CE Mark credibility for Business

Problems with borderline products

Problems with the numbers of national/local regulators enforcement duties



CE Mark credibility for the Inspectorate

- Inspections carried out are risk assessed against national guidance
- Invaluable for identifying non-compliance

- Free movement of goods makes advising businesses easier
- Established routes to compliance makes advice and enforcement easier to understand





CE Mark credibility for the Inspectorate

Technical offences

Counterfeiting/Deliberate non-compliance

Enforcement action needs to be proportionate

Compliance levels in UK relatively high





CE Mark credibility for the State

Recognised regime with regards to earned recognition

Market Surveillance co-ordinating role





Market Surveillance in the UK

Delivered at a local level

Responsive to National/European needs

Respected regime of Border Control

Recalls & RAPEX System used appropriately





CE Mark credibility for the consumer

It does not signify a product is safe

Is such a misconception a bad thing?

Further intervention will probably cause more confusion

CE Marking is an established regime in the EEC, it has credibility with stakeholders. The situation could be improved in the UK specifically, but this would take considerable resource to do so with arguably negligible benefit.....
